 It depends on your family and how active you are. Ask a vet or breeder.
 Yes. It is illegal not to.
 No, hitting hurts. Hands are for nice things like food and pats.
 Vaccinations, worming, fleas/ticks, teeth
 So it is under control, does not frighten other animals or people and does not get scared or run away.
 So your dog does not try to run away or get into trouble with another dog, person or animal
 A dog guard, crate or a seat belt harness.
 Make sure it doesn't jump out, put it on a lead
 It might die from heatstroke.
 Be calm and quiet, don't run towards it with arm raised. Let it sniff you. Ask the owner's permission to pat it.
 Stand still and quiet (no screams), don't look it in the eye. If you have a bike put it between you and the dog to protect yourself.
 In the garden or in the gutter if you are on the street.
 No – it might get a fright.
 Do not touch it until it has finished eating.
 Let go of the lead and go for help.

| <p>21. How old should a puppy be before it leaves its mum?</p> | <p>Minimum 8 weeks old as it needs time to grow and learn things from its mum.</p> |
| <p>22. What does the puppy need before it can meet other dogs?</p> | <p>Its vaccinations to stop it from getting sick.</p> |
| <p>23. What items will you need to look after your puppy?</p> | <p>Collar, lead, (harness), bowls, food, toys, poo bags, bed.</p> |
| <p>24. How often should you take a puppy outside to learn to do the toilet?</p> | <p>Lots! After every meal, when it wakes up, after play and if it sniffs at the floor or door.</p> |
| <p>25. What should you teach your puppy first?</p> | <p>Its name, Sit, Stay, Come.</p> |
| <p>26. What other things could you teach your puppy?</p> | <p>No jumping up, no stealing food, no licking or biting people.</p> |
| <p>27. How should you correct your puppy?</p> | <p>With a firm voice e.g. "No" and reward good behaviour with a treat or toy.</p> |
| <p>28. How old should your puppy be when you start training classes?</p> | <p>After he has had all his vaccinations. Ask your vet or the puppy trainer.</p> |
| <p>29. How many times a day should you feed your puppy?</p> | <p>Depends on its age. Usually two or three small meals. Ask your vet.</p> |
| <p>30. Where should you get a dog from?</p> | <p>Rescue Centre, Reputable Breeder.</p> |
| <p>31. What information must your dog have on its identification tag on its collar?</p> | <p>Owner's name, phone number and Postcode.</p> |
| <p>32. How many times a day should you feed an adult dog?</p> | <p>Once or twice.</p> |
| <p>33. Should dogs be fed human food?</p> | <p>Many types of human food are not good for dogs, e.g. chocolate can make them very sick</p> |
| <p>34. How much exercise will your dog need?</p> | <p>Walk at least twice a day. Depending on its age and size the time and distance will vary.</p> |
| <p>35. What are the special things that dogs do to help people?</p> | <p>Guide the Blind, help the deaf, police dogs, sniff out drugs or bodies, mountain rescue, shepherds, visit sick or elderly people, autism or dementia helpers etc.</p> |
